# E-Safety and Acceptable Use Policy

### 1. Purpose

To keep young people safe when using technology during sessions and to support responsible use of digital devices.

#### 2. Our Commitment

We take online safety seriously and ensure that young people, staff, and families understand how to stay safe online.

All staff are trained in e-safety and safeguarding.

### 3. How We Keep Young People Safe Online

- All internet access at our venues is supervised.
- Tutors check the suitability of websites and apps before use.
- Devices provided by Beyond Limits include filtering or restricted-use settings.
- Young people are taught how to navigate the online world safely and respectfully.

# 4. Expectations for Young People

During sessions, learners are expected to:

- Only access websites, apps, or games agreed with their tutor.
- Use devices respectfully and safely.
- Never share personal information such as address, phone number, or passwords.
- Report anything online that worries them.

# 5. Expectations for Staff

Staff must:

- Supervise all online activity during sessions.
- Use devices only for educational or therapeutic purposes.
- Record any e-safety concerns and share with the DSL immediately.
- Model good digital behaviour.

#### 6. Social Media

- Learners must not access personal social media accounts during sessions.
- Staff are strictly prohibited from communicating with learners via personal social media.
- Parents and carers are asked to support healthy boundaries at home.

# 7. Cyberbullying

We have zero tolerance for cyberbullying.

All cases will be managed through the safeguarding policy and behaviour expectations.

# 8. Reporting Concerns

Learners are encouraged to speak to a trusted adult if:

- Something online frightens them
- They see inappropriate content
- Someone contacts them in a way that feels unsafe

Staff must report concerns to the DSL on the same day.

### 9. Devices and Personal Phones

- Tutoring devices are used for learning only.
- Learners may bring phones but should not use them during sessions unless part of a planned activity.
- Tutors may ask learners to put phones away if they become a distraction or present a risk.
